

Dear friends,

The journey to re-release THE WAR AT HOME in theaters has been challenging and rewarding.

To date, 259 backers have donated just over \$35,000 to our Kickstarter fundraising campaign, surpassing our initial goal to support the release of the new 4K restoration of THE WAR AT HOME.

*The opening at The Metrograph cinema in New York City is now set for an **October 12th**, for at least a one-week run. We have also just confirmed bookings in San Francisco, Berkeley, and Los Angeles to open early Fall before the midterm elections.*

*There are just **3 days left** in the campaign. The new "Stretch Goal" is \$45K, so we can broaden the release of the film, which we are hoping to open in ten cities. We only need \$9,387 to reach this new goal – and with your help, we can get there!*


